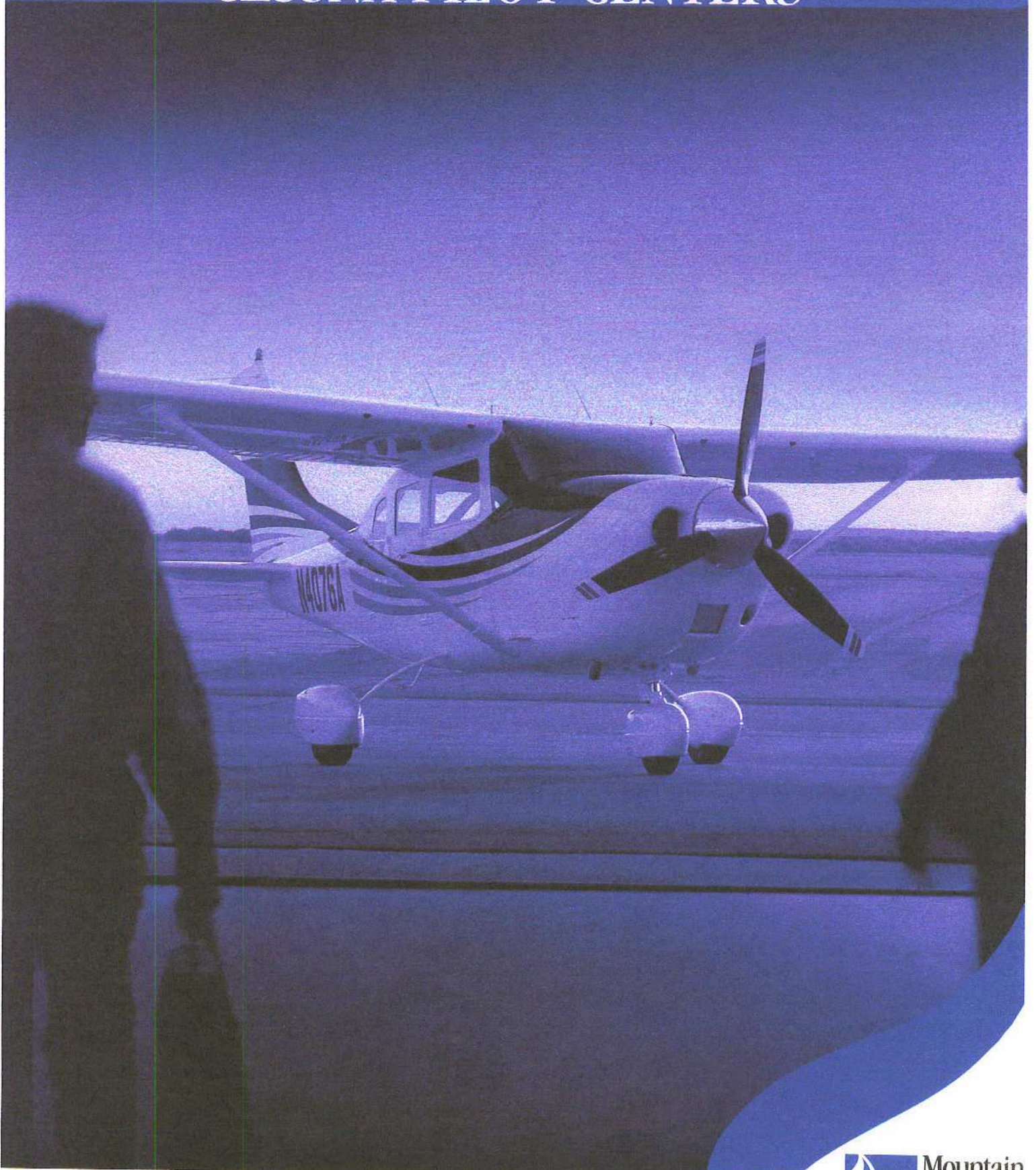


EARN UNIVERSITY CREDIT FOR FLIGHT TRAINING AT CESSNA PILOT CENTERS



When you complete your flight training at any Cessna Pilot Center, you can also be earning credit toward a university degree — at no additional charge!

An agreement between Cessna and Mountain State University assigns academic credit for the FAA certificates and ratings you earn after completing CPC training. You can receive up to 50 hours of credit for CPC training, depending on the ratings you hold and the degree you are working toward. That's like receiving a scholarship from MSU for up to \$12,250.

If you're considering a career as a professional pilot, an aviation degree will greatly expand your options for employment and advancement. Or, if you plan to work in a field outside aviation, MSU's degree in organizational leadership is relevant to virtually any workplace and role.

HOW IT WORKS

Once you have completed a CPC course for a pilot certificate or rating and passed the FAA Knowledge and Practical Test, send MSU a copy of the certificate or rating together with the applicable test scores and training records. These materials are reviewed and a credit is issued.

You can complete the remaining credit for your degree through one of MSU's convenient learning options. If you have already earned credit from another college or university, you can arrange for it to be reviewed for transfer to your degree program. You must complete a minimum number of credit hours at MSU: 18 for the A.S. in aviation technology, 30 for the B.S. in aviation leadership and management, or 48 for the B.S. in organizational leadership.

ELIGIBLE DEGREE PROGRAMS

You can apply credit earned through CPC to three professionally oriented degrees:

Associate of Science in Aviation Technology

The A.S. program in aviation technology provides a general academic foundation for aviation professionals. The program combines 27 credit hours of coursework with 40 hours of additional aviation credit (including up to 40 hours earned for flight training). All coursework for the program is offered through independent study, in which you learn individually at your own pace under the direction of a faculty member.

Bachelor of Science in Aviation Leadership and Management

Focused on current and projected industry needs, the B.S. program in aviation leadership and management provides preparation for advancement in aviation management and flight operations. The program brings together 24 credit hours of leadership and management coursework, 36 hours of general education courses, and 68 hours of aviation studies (including up to 50 hours earned for flight training). All coursework for the program is offered through independent study, in which you learn individually at your own pace under the direction of a faculty member.

Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership

A broad-based leadership program designed to provide an understanding of organizational dynamics along with skills in critical thinking, problem solving, and decision making, the B.S. program in organizational leadership is relevant to a wide range of

professional roles, organizations, and industries. An accelerated format combines once-a-week class meetings, weekly online chats, and group and individual assignments. New groups of students are formed regularly; each group completes the entire program together to foster support and interaction among students. The degree includes 48 hours of organizational leadership credit, 44 hours of electives (all or some of which can be fulfilled with credit earned for flight training), and 36 hours of general education courses. The general education component can be fulfilled through transfer credit, independent study, or a classroom program, and must be complete before you can begin the organizational leadership program. The program is offered online, on any MSU campus (Beckley and Martinsburg, W.Va.; Center Township, Pa.; and Orlando, Fla.), and at selected sites throughout West Virginia.

GETTING STARTED

You can apply and enroll at any time (although the start date for organizational leadership students will depend on the next available group). Simply submit an application for admission to MSU with a copy of your high school diploma or GED, as well as official transcripts for any college credit you have earned elsewhere, and the \$25 application fee. Mountain State maintains an open enrollment policy, although some restrictions apply to the organizational leadership program.

COURSES AND CREDIT

Mountain State University awards the following credits for CPC training:

Private Pilot	6
Instrument Rating	8
Commercial Pilot	11
Flight Instructor	8
Instrument Flight Instructor	4
Multi-Engine Rating	3
Multi-Engine Flight Instructor	4

Additional credits may be awarded for FAA certificates and ratings not typically offered at Cessna Pilot Centers, such as the airline transport pilot certificate and type ratings. While there is no specific limit to the number of credits you can obtain on the basis of FAA credentials, the amount of credit that you can apply to your degree is limited and varies by program.
